For credit courses, admission to Lakeland is open to:

- A. New first time in college students who are high school graduates, students who hold a GED, and non-high school graduates whose high school class has already graduated and have successfully completed the Ability to Benefit test.
- B. Dual enrolled students who meet the program eligibility requirements, such as College Credit Plus.
- C. Transfer students with prior postsecondary experience.
- D. Transient students who are matriculated at another college, enroll for one term only, and expect to return to their home school for continued study.
- E. Non-degree/non-certificate students who enroll to take courses for personal enrichment or professional development. Non-degree/non-certificate students must be a high school graduate or have obtained a high school diploma equivalency.

Admission to the college does not guarantee entrance into programs with selective admission criteria.
