# NEW AND TRANSFER STUDENT ENROLLMENT CHECKLIST

## ✓ Apply for Admission

All new students need to apply for admission to Lakeland. Apply online at [lakelandcc.edu/apply](https://lakelandcc.edu/apply).

## ✓ Submit Transcripts

All **new first-year students** are required to submit an official final high school transcript or a GED transcript.

All **new transfer students** are required to submit an official final high school transcript or a GED transcript. This requirement may be waived for students who have completed 15 or more credit hours at an accredited post-secondary institution.

In addition, transfer students are required to submit official transcripts from **all** post-secondary institutions previously attended, regardless of whether credit was earned.

Please contact your former high school and/or postsecondary institution(s) to request your transcripts be sent directly to Lakeland's Admissions Office.

## ✓ Take the Placement Test (if required)

Lakeland requires placement testing in English and mathematics prior to course registration. Once officially admitted to Lakeland, students can schedule a placement test through myLakeland to help determine proper course selection; a scheduled appointment is required. For placement test or for test preparation information, visit [lakelandcc.edu/placement](https://lakelandcc.edu/placement).

Students may be exempt from placement testing if they meet one of the following:

- Submit college readiness level ACT or SAT scores in math and English or an official high school transcript with required unweighted GPA and/or specific course subject grade. For more information, visit [lakelandcc.edu/placement](https://lakelandcc.edu/placement) and click on the Math and English Placement Summary document.
- Enroll in a certificate program.
- Accepted as a visiting student from another college or university or as a non-degree/non-certificate student
- Completed college-level English/math from a regionally accredited college or university. Eligible English and math courses can be used to meet placement requirements.

## ✓ Complete New Student Orientation (NSO)

New Student Orientation will need to be completed in two separate parts. For the first part, all students must complete the the Lakeland 101 online course through their myLakeland account. (Once officially admitted to Lakeland, students will receive instructions on how to access Lakeland 101 via their Lakeland student email.) Once part one is completed, students will attend in-person New Student Orientation where they will meet with an academic counselor or advisor; register for classes; discuss access

to technology; receive information about financial aid/ scholarships; get a student ID card; and receive information on textbooks. A scheduled appointment is required..

This requirement is waived for students who have earned a bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited post-secondary institution.

## ✓ Pay Tuition and Fees

Lakeland offers many types of financial assistance, including federal and state grants, loans, work-study employment and over 130 scholarships that can reduce the costs of a college education. To apply for financial aid at Lakeland, students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [studentaid.gov/fafsa](https://studentaid.gov/fafsa) using Lakeland's school code of 006804. Students can also apply for scholarships at Lakeland through the Scholarship Center in myLakeland (under myRECORDS). # TYPES OF CLASSES

## Co-op/Field

A co-op/field course provides on-the-job experience which takes place off-campus in support of a student's field of study.

## Hybrid/Hybrid Lab

The hybrid (blended) course provides the advantages of weekly face-to-face interaction between faculty and students with the flexibility and convenience of less time in the classroom. Significant coursework and interactions between instructor, students, and classmates take place both in the on-campus classroom and online. The total amount of time required for the blended course is typically the same as with a traditional face-to-face course. The percentage of face-to-face on-campus classroom time is reduced as time devoted to online activities is increased.

## Video Conferencing

Video Conferencing classrooms combine traditional face-to-face instruction with online learning by using live video to connect two or more classrooms. Students located in one classroom on campus can interact in real-time with an instructor and students in another location.

## Lecture/Lab (Face-to-Face)

Lecture and lab course types provide traditional face-to-face instruction in an on-campus classroom and/or on-campus laboratory.

## Online/Online Lab

In an online course, all course instruction is delivered completely online. Students are not required to come to campus to participate in any portion of the coursework or evaluation. There are no required synchronous (real-time) scheduled interactions (e.g., web-conferencing, chat, proctored exams). It is important to note, the online course is not self-paced; students are expected to complete assignments and assessments on a schedule that is similar to the traditional course and aligns with the regular academic calendar.

## Online WSR/WSR Lab

The online with synchronous requirements (WSR) course is delivered primarily online using Blackboard. The difference between the fully online and online WSR is there are some required remote face-to-face or synchronous (real-time) interactions, such as: class orientation, regularly scheduled chat or web-conferencing sessions, and/or proctored exams. Please refer to the course syllabus for specific course requirements.

## Self-Paced Courses

Self-paced courses are on-campus and computer-based to allow students to work at their own pace with instructor assistance.

# PAYING FOR COLLEGE

## TUITION AND FEES

Lakeland provides quality education at an affordable price. Lakeland's tuition is about one-third the cost of most four-year schools.

General fee\* is \$11.80 per credit hour for a maximum of 15 credit hours per term. The general fee is used to defray the costs of admissions, registration and other direct student services.

Career services fee\*\* is \$8.25 per credit hour for a maximum of 15 credit hours per term. The fee is used to cover such direct career services as academic planning, career counseling, transfer, and employment strategies. College Credit Plus students, students participating in apprenticeship programs, students age 60 and older auditing a class and students taking noncredit classes are exempt from the career services fee.

Tuition and fees are subject to change.

- In addition to the general instructional fees, career services fee, and support services fee, students may be charged supplemental course and incidental fees due to the nature of certain courses. Supplemental fees are noted in the course listings available in the online schedule viewer in [myLakeland](https://myLakeland).
- The support services fee of \$14.25 per term (\$4.25 for summer term) is paid by all students enrolled for credit irrespective of the number of credit hours taken. The fee covers parking, shuttle service, safety, exterior lighting, and cultural events; or rental of off-campus facilities.
- Senior citizens 60 years or older are offered a tuition waiver program allowing them to audit credit courses on a space-available basis. Senior citizens are responsible for purchasing course materials and books, as well as paying for the general, lab, and student support service fees.

To benefit from the senior citizen tuition waiver, a senior citizen must complete an [Admissions Application](#) (first-time applicants only) and an [Audit Request - Senior Citizen form](#) to be certified as eligible. Once certified as eligible (Ohio resident, 60 years of age or older, provide proof of age and residency via Ohio driver's license or state issued I.D.), senior citizens may register during course registration dates. View pages 1-3 for registration dates for summer term or fall or spring semesters.

### Residency Requirements

Residency requirements for Resident of Lake County; Ohio resident outside Lake County; and Out-of-state are posted under [Tuition & Fees](#) on the college website. Tuition will only be adjusted prior to or no later than the first day of the term. If the request for change of residency is made after the start of the term, the residency decision will be made for the following term. A change of residency may impact financial aid eligibility.

A change of address does not automatically change residency status. All students requesting a change of tuition to in-county or in-state will need to complete the [Request for Change of Residency Form](#) (myLakeland login credentials required) and upload the required documentation for review and approval by the Office of the Registrar.

### Paying with Financial Assistance

- If students have received a financial aid offer notification via [myLakeland](http://myLakeland), and have registered for the minimum number of credit hours required to receive the aid, aid will be applied to tuition charges.
- Class attendance will be reported by faculty.
- Refunds of excess financial aid will be released to students after attendance in their classes has been verified by Lakeland's Financial Aid Office. This process begins at the end of the second week of the semester. Students will receive their refund via check unless they are enrolled in eRefunds (direct deposit).\*

- Indirect educational expenses are the student's responsibility until the credit balance is received.
- Students not receiving the results of their financial aid application at the time of registration should inquire about applying for a Tuition Loan Payment Plan.

### eRefunds

Students are encouraged to register for electronic refunds, the quick, convenient and secure method of having refunds directly deposited into their bank account. Sign up in the "Billing Center" in myLakeland (see page 13 for instructions).

Lakeland Community College has over 130 scholarships available that can remarkably reduce the costs of a college education. Most scholarships provide funding toward tuition expenses, but they may also help with the costs for books and educational supplies. Not all scholarships require a high GPA, with some based solely on where a student lives, went to high school or major. Students can quickly and easily apply for scholarships through a one-step application process in the Scholarship Center.

## WITHDRAWALS / CANCELLATIONS

### Administrative Withdrawal Policy

Students will be administratively withdrawn from any class in which they are enrolled and have not attended during the first two weeks of the semester. Students are not permitted to begin attendance in a class after the second week. Administrative withdrawals will occur at the beginning of the third week of classes at a 50% refund for any student who the instructor marked as not attended.

### Withdrawal From Classes

Students are able to withdraw from a class during the specified date ranges. A course withdrawal will be indicated on a student's academic record by a grade of "W". Failure to attend class(es) does not constitute withdrawal and may result in a failing grade. Students should consult pages 1-3, Important Dates, for appropriate deadlines regarding withdrawal for all semesters/terms.

### Cancelled Classes

Occasionally the college must cancel a class because of insufficient enrollment. Students enrolled in the class will be notified of the cancellation as soon as possible and may replace the cancelled class. Students who do not wish to make a substitution will have a reversal of charges for the cancelled class posted to their student account. The college reserves the right to cancel any classes due to unforeseen circumstances. Students with financial aid should call or email Lakeland's Financial Aid Office or stop by Lakeland's Student Service Center to determine how aid is affected.

# ACTIVITIES, ENGAGEMENT AND SUPPORT

Lakeland provides many services and programs to support and enhance the college experience. Most services are free or offered at a very low cost.

**Arts at Lakeland** – concerts presented by musical groups (band, chorus, flute choir, jazz orchestra and orchestra); Events are held in the Dr. Wayne L. Rodehorst Performing Arts Center, located in the D-Building.

**Athletic and Fitness Center (AFC)** – on-campus athletic facility with an indoor track, basketball and racquetball courts, locker rooms, and a weight room equipped with free weights, nautilus equipment, treadmills, ellipticals and stationary bikes.

Lakeland Community College offers eight varsity athletic teams. Lakeland's team is known as the Lakers, and they participate in Region XII of the NJCAA and the Ohio Community College Athletic Conference (OCCAC).

**Women's sports** – basketball, soccer, softball, volleyball

**Co-ed sports** – esports

**Campus Kids (child care center)** – on-site, state licensed and accredited childcare center for the children of students who are enrolled in credit classes at the college or in the Holden Partnership Programs.

**Campus Police** – operates as an autonomous police district and is dedicated to protecting and serving the college community. Lakeland's Police Department offers a 24-hour emergency communications and dispatch center and is part of the Ohio Collaborative for law enforcement in the State of Ohio.

**Career Services Center** – assists current Lakeland students and alumni to obtain employment and career-related experiential learning, both on and off campus. Career Services provides workshops and maintains an up-to-date job board of regional employment opportunities.

**Computer labs and free Wi-Fi** – Computers are available for use outside the Student Service Center and in the Lakeland Library.

**Counseling and Advising Center** – offered to full-time, part-time and potential students, services include admissions/course selection support, educational planning, career exploration, personal counseling, explanations of college policies and procedures, and psychological counseling.

**Laketran** – Lakeland students can ride Laketran Local Routes 1-9 to and from the college for free by showing their Lakeland Student ID.

**Learning Center** – offers free hybrid academic learning support services to students for most classes. Academic learning support includes tutoring, writing center consultations, math-in-minutes, and study skills coaching. Contact the learning center for more information or assistance making an appointment at 440-525-7019.

**Library** – a full-service library offering an expansive listing of titles, research assistance, free use of computers, anatomy and physiology models, quiet study rooms, copy equipment, and educational programs for information literacy.

**Parking and Shuttle Service** – parking is available at no charge to students and visitors and is conveniently located around campus. The college also offers a free shuttle bus service, in partnership with Laketran. The Campus Loop shuttle serves nine bus stop locations with service every 10 minutes connecting all points from the Transit Center to the T-Building, and everywhere in between. A handicapped parking lot is located behind Lakeland's B-Building for those with a valid permit.

**Student Engagement and Leadership** – exists to enhance the students' lives outside the classroom. They provide social, educational, and leadership opportunities to encourage personal and professional growth. They oversee Lakeland Student Government, the Campus Activities Board, all other student organizations, and campus involvement.

Lakeland Community College's College Credit Plus Program (CCP) offers high school students the opportunity to enroll at Lakeland on a part-time or full-time basis, and earn college credit, which may also be used to fulfill their high school graduation requirements. The intent of the CCP program is to offer a broad range of college level classes, which provide educational opportunities not typically available in high school. Admission into this program is open to students who have clearly demonstrated the ability to handle college-level coursework. Interested students should attend an information session, complete an application, submit a high school transcript and complete the required permission slip, take the placement test, and attend a CCP registration session. ## STUDENT SUCCESS

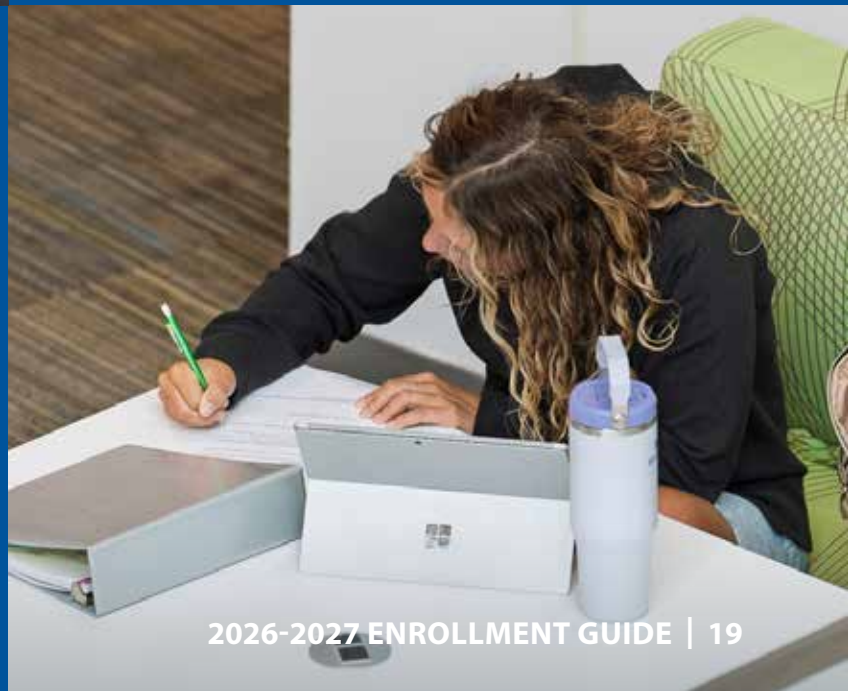

For many students, Lakeland is the first step on their higher education journey. Students can save on the cost of their education by taking as many classes at Lakeland as possible. Students can complete the first two years of a bachelor's degree and then transfer to most four-year colleges or universities. Many four-year institutions also offer transfer scholarships, making the cost even more affordable. Depending on the major, students may be able to stay at Lakeland to finish their four-year degree by participating in the Holden Partnership Programs.

Lakeland has many general articulation agreements and transfer guides for Ohio colleges and universities. Ohio Transfer 36 and Transfer Assurance Guide (TAG) course credits are guaranteed to transfer to any public college or university in Ohio. Students can check for course equivalencies at [transferology.com](http://transferology.com) or [transfercredit.ohio.gov](http://transfercredit.ohio.gov). Lakeland Community College is nationally accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, and our courses are recognized by all other accredited colleges across the country, so the credits can transfer to private or out-of-state institutions.



Lakeland's Transfer Center strives to provide a seamless process for students transferring college credits to and from Lakeland Community College. With this goal in mind, the transfer center provides the following services to all Lakeland students:

- Assisting with all phases of the transfer credit process.

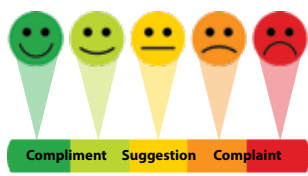

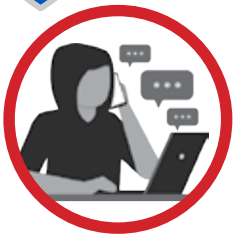

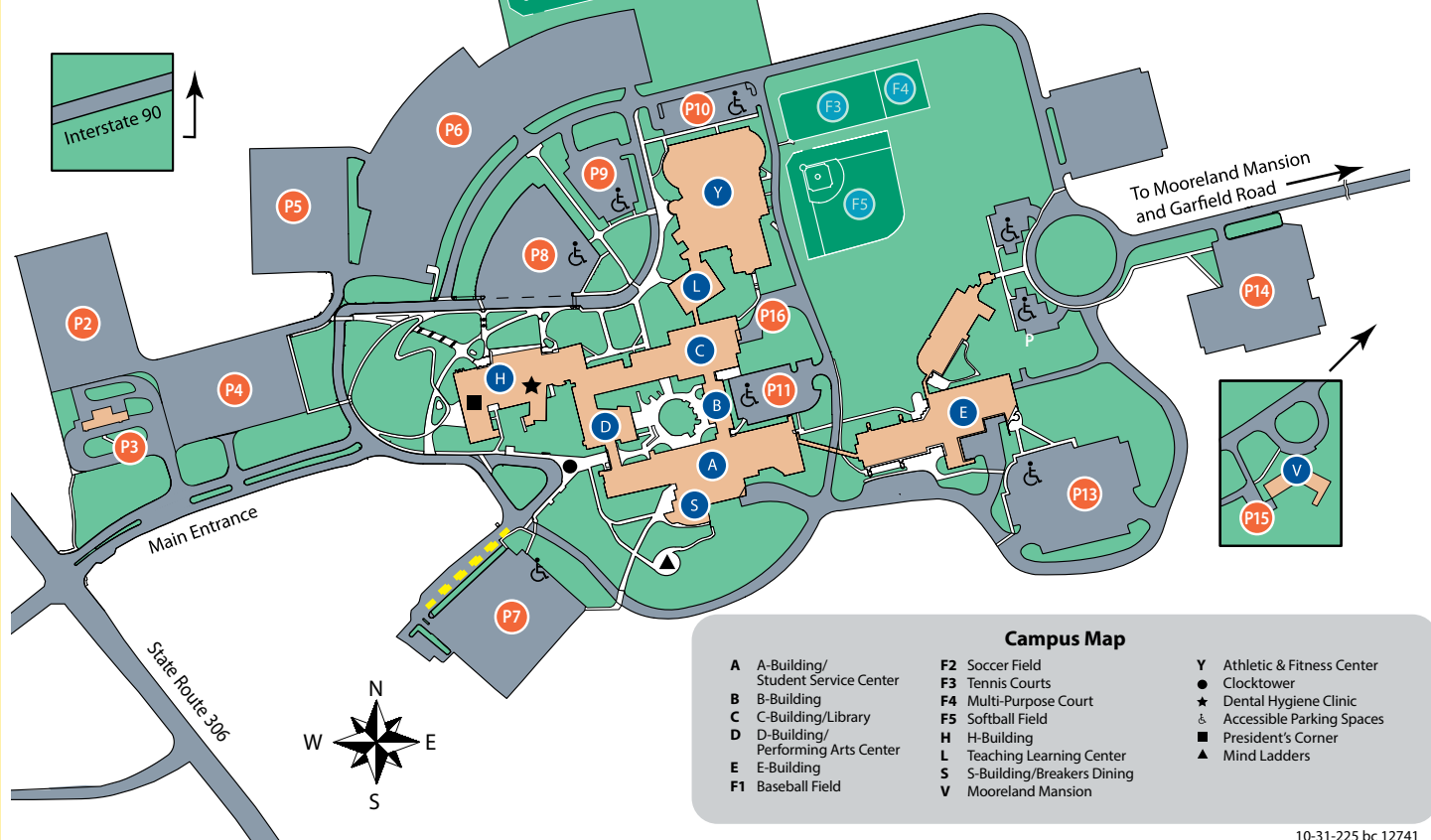
